# So WHAT CAN PERIOPERATIVE TEAMS DO TO REDUCE THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT?


REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE!

  - \*Non-regulated non-recyclable waste










Pharmaceutical waste recycling is imperative for diverting hazards from our waterways and protecting marine life

Large items that can alternatively be recycled have poked holes through garbage, which could cause harm to team members






Sharps containers should only house sharps. These are actual discoveries found in sharps containers when rounding. This is a safety issue – the covers of the sharps containers have been removed to accommodate. It additionally affects finances.

- Partnering with vendors for recycling/ reprocessing of single-use disposable instruments and items is strategic for costsavings initiatives
- Negotiating of contracts helps ensure adequate supply and financial return



# RECYCLING CAN ALSO HELP WITH THE CURRENT BACKORDER ISSUES WITH CERTAIN ITEMS

For example, single-use tourniquets, which are on a current backorder, are reprocessed and everything we give back to the company is returned sterile for use at a reduced cost.
