Seeds & Sustainability

Using funding from the Sustainable California Libraries Grant, Seeds & Sustainability brings Seed Library installations, all ages programming, and a themed print and digital collection to communities in need throughout San Diego County to encourage gardening, composting, and greater knowledge of environmental justice. The goal of the Seeds & Sustainability Project is to provide customers with the resources and information they need to move toward having a positive impact on the environment through gardening and composting.

PROJECT OUTCOME GOALS

- Install 11 Seed Libraries
- Host 33 programs (3 per branch)
- Distribute 2,750 packets of seeds (250 per branch)
- Order and circulate 500 digital and print books to support learning program topics
- Develop 3 booklists (one for each age group)






