BACKGROUND


- State boards of dentistry regulate the practice of dentistry and protect the public
 - 1. Licensure qualifications and issuance
 - 2. Establish practice and conduct standards
 - 3. Take Disciplinary Actions (DA)
- Physicians who are not board certified have more frequent and severe DA
- The American Board of Pediatric Dentistry (ABPD) is the certifying board for Pediatric Dentistry
- ABPD has initial certification (IC) and Renewal of Certification Process (ROC-P)
 - IC: Qualifying Exam & Oral Clinical Exam
 - ROC-P:
 - Yearly: Professional Standing, CE, Continuous Quality Improvement Modules
 - 10-year: ROC Exam
- Purpose: To assess if
 - 1. Board Certified PD (BCPD) have lower incidence of DA than non-BCPD (n-BCPD)
 - 2. Timely completion of yearly ROC requirements affects incidence of DA
 - 3. First time pass of ROC examination affects incidence of DA


METHODS






Figure 1: States Included in Data

- Inclusion Criteria: 1) PD, 2) Practicing in 5 most populous states in each AAPD District (Figure 1)
- PD identified through NPI database "Pediatric Dentistry" taxonomy
- Board Certification, ROC-P and ROC exam data obtained through ABPD records
- <u>DA</u> obtained through **public records** 2006-2021
- Descriptive Statistics for outcomes and predictors
- Negative binomial regression w/ offset for log of years used for analysis with 5% significance level

RESULTS


- Approved by Indiana University IRB (Protocol 14022)
- 9363 pediatric dentists identified
 - Complete data collected for 8874









ABPD Certified

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Overall incidence of disciplinary action for pediatric dentists is very low
- 2. <u>Board Certified Pediatric Dentists</u> had <u>significantly lower</u> incidence disciplinary actions than non-certified pediatric dentists
- 3. Pediatric dentists who complete yearly ROC-P requirements on time had significantly lower incidence of disciplinary actions
