- As the prevalence of diabetes continues to rise, more trained nurses are required to help people affected avoid life-changing complications and promote healthier lifestyle behaviors.
- Although global organizations warned of shortfall of nurses and called national leaders to invest in adequately trained nursing workforce, few governments have successfully created networks for nursing professional development in diabetes care and education (DCE)


 Review current standards in international certification for diabetes nurses and challenges in equipping nurses to become change leaders

FUTURE DIRECTIONS

- Creation of the Certification in Diabetes for nurses
- in Brazil via Federal Council of Nursing by 2023
- By July 2024 increase of 100% in DiabetesPro members
- Insertion of Certified Nurses in private practice
- Creation of insurance policies for reimbursement of diabetes education
