

A Community Engagement Student Project Addressing Social Determinants of Health in Community Pharmacy

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Objective

The objective of this project is to describe the development and implementation of a semester-long project that applies the knowledge of the social determinants of health (SDOH) to the development and delivery of pharmacy services in the community setting.

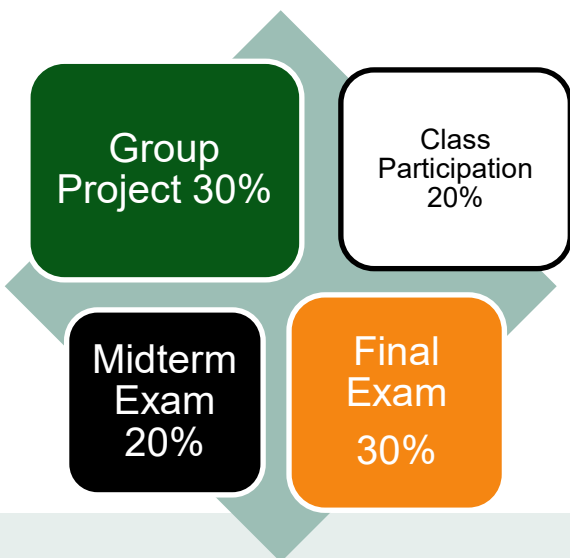
Methods

The SDOH and Community Engagement Project was modeled after the BUILD Health Challenge (a funding collaborative and award program)

- Modified and implemented in a Community Pharmacy Elective course for second-year PharmD students
- Semester-long project timeline
- Groups of 4-6 students

Project Grade Breakdown: 200 points total

- Community Needs Assessment = 50 (25%)
 - (Worksheet + Interview)
- Project Proposal = 60 (30%)
- Final Presentation = 40 (20%)
- Peer Evaluation = 50 (25%)

Conclusions

The SDOH and Community Engagement Project is an innovative way to develop structural competency for students interested in practicing in community pharmacy.

This activity was effective at inspiring innovation and entrepreneurial thinking about the social determinants of health as it pertains to community pharmacy.

Results

- From 2021-2023, a total of 10 proposals were developed and presented.
- The most common social risk factor addressed through this project was transportation (n=6, 60%)

Reported Challenges

- Difficult to prioritize vs therapeutics courses
- Percentage of final grade in course
- Semester-long time-frame added pressure
- Group work and shared responsibility

Accommodations

- Provided 2 hours of class time to work on project
- Thoughtful timeline (awareness of integrated exams)
- Required proposal draft and provided timely feedback
- Deadline extensions prn with no penalty
- Individual final grades based on peer evaluation
